The Yukon Forum Joint Priority Action Plan is the result of the collaborative work being done at the Yukon Forum and direction from Yukon First Nation and Government of Yukon leaders as committed to in the *Working Together* Declaration.

The goal of the Yukon Forum is to foster reconciliation, develop strong government-to-government relations and collaborate on priorities shared by the Government of Yukon and Yukon First Nations.

This Action Plan lays out the next steps that will be undertaken by our joint working groups on a number of topics that are deeply important to Yukoners – fiscal relations, Land Claims and Self-Government implementation and bi-lateral/tri-lateral processes for engagement.

Intergovernmental collaboration on this scale has not been done before. Establishing effective processes for intergovernmental collaboration takes time, careful consideration and flexibility in order to be successful.

The joint priorities identified by our governments address long standing and complex issues. In many cases we are not starting from scratch - past reviews have been completed and existing processes are in place. This Action Plan outlines the high level next steps to undertake an inventory and analysis of existing processes. Many of these priority areas will also require engagement and participation from the Government of Canada.

It is expected that more detailed work plans will be developed and will capture the specific details, processes, timelines and budgetary needs for each priority identified through the Yukon Forum Joint Priority Action Plan.

As stated in the *Working Together* Declaration, our governments are committed to working together in the spirit of reconciliation and collaboration and with this Action Plan we have laid out the next steps for our shared work on these priorities.
